

## VIETNAM VETERANS OF AMERICA WESTCHESTER COUNTY CHAPTER #49 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM

Vietnam Veterans of America - Chapter #49, awards six scholarships of \$1,000 each year to high school or vocational school graduates in Westchester County. These scholarships honor six outstanding individuals from our area. The scholarships are named, the Pete Lambert Memorial Scholarship, the Congressman Hamilton Fish Jr. Memorial Scholarship, the Peter T. McCauley Memorial Scholarship, the Anthony Shine Memorial Scholarship, the Jonathan Shine Memorial Scholarship, and the William Suddereth Memorial Scholarship.

**ELIGIBILITY:** Students who will complete high school in Westchester County this year, are the child or a grandchild of an active-duty service veteran, and plan to attend an accredited college/university or vocational/technical school are eligible to compete for the scholarships. **Please note** that service in the Reserves or National Guard does not make up veteran status unless they were activated for more than 90 days for purposes other than training. **Also note** that the child/grandchild of any veteran is eligible; service does not have to be during the Vietnam era.

**HOW TO APPLY:** There are five selection criteria that the student must submit to be considered for a scholarship:

- **1.** DD-214 or honorable discharge of parent/grandparent
- 2. SAT/ACT scores; **Note**: for those who will be attending a vocational/technical school this requirement will be waived. If your School does not offer ACT/SAT tests, then we request that high School staff provide a record of the student's academic or vocational achievements such as report cards or other grade transcripts.
- **3.** A resume of extracurricular activities to include school clubs, sports and student government, work experience, volunteer experience and other interests. Relevant references, with addresses and phone numbers, should be provided.
- **4.** A written statement, not to exceed two typed pages, on the topic "The effect (if any) of my parent's/grandparent's military service on my attitudes toward life and country."
- 5. Student, parent/guardian, and School staff must sign application.

Students should complete the attached application and return it, along with the other requested items, by **April 1, 2023,** to Vietnam Veterans of America #49

**SELECTION OF AWARDEES AND PRESENTATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS:** VVA #49 Scholarship Committee is solely responsible for the selection process. In late April, the Committee will notify those selected for scholarships and their high schools. The acceptance and enrollment of those selected in an accredited college or technical school will be verified. Scholarship awards will be presented at our May meeting or mailed to the awardees.

THE SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE WILL NOT CONSIDER APPLICATIONS THAT DO NOT CONTAIN ALL OF THE REQUESTED INFORMATION IN ITS REQUIRED FORM OR ARE RECEIVED AFTER THE SUBMITTAL DATE.

# The Camp Lejeune Justice Act Evaluating and Understanding the Benefits with Answers to Frequently Asked Questions

#### **Ensuring You Understand the "Offset"**

The U.S. Government has recently confirmed the troubling news about toxicants at Camp Lejeune, confirming what many have suspected for decades. *The Camp Lejeune Justice Act* applies to military personnel, their families, and civilians who were exposed to the toxic water supply for at least 30 days between Aug. 1, 1953, and Dec. 31, 1987. Exposure to the toxic water at Camp Lejeune has caused multiple forms of cancer, neurological disorders, miscarriage, and death, among other injuries. Since the passage of the *PACT Act* in August, mass-tort firms all over the country have been saturating the airwaves with advertising offering speedy settlements with no strings attached.


Vietnam Veterans of America and Bergmann & Moore have worked together for nearly 20 years to provide effective legal representation for veterans (at no cost) who have VA disability benefits claims pending in federal court. Since 2010, Bergmann & Moore has successfully represented over 1,100 VVA members and their families in disability appeal claims.

Recently, Vietnam Veterans of America and B&M expanded their long-standing association to include the historic *Camp Lejeune Justice Act*.

Although the *Camp Lejeune Justice Act* potentially offers significant benefits to veterans and their families, these benefits need to be carefully evaluated by a firm that understands VA disability benefits, as the law contains an offset.

**Bergmann & Moore** is working with Vietnam Veterans of America to ensure veterans and their families understand the offset and will work to ensure a CLJA benefit is not accepted before the claimant understands whether (and to what degree) VA disability benefits or care may be affected.

#### Q: Is Bergmann and Moore accredited by VA?

A: Yes. Bergmann and Moore is managed by former VA attorneys who are accredited by VA.

# Q: Will VA benefits I have received reduce an award under the *Camp Lejeune Act?*

A: The language of the CLJA indicates that there will be some sort of offset. It's unclear at this time what that offset will be, however. It appears very likely that an award received under the CLJA will be reduced by the amount of VA disability benefits received pursuant to presumptions of in-service chemical exposure at Camp Lejeune. The extent to which this will happen is unknown, however.

# Q: Will an award made under the *Camp Lejeune Act* reduce my monthly VA benefits payments?

A: The short answer is that no one knows right now. This is our greatest worry, however – in fact it's why Bergmann & Moore decided we had to be involved in this litigation.

Q: What will Bergmann & Moore do to help prevent my VA and other benefits from being reduced by an award made under the *Camp Lejeune Act*?

A: Although the offset rules aren't even known yet, we're already working with a national firm to create an algorithm to give our clients notice about potential reductions in other benefits they receive. We will also use our experience in VA disability benefits law (we have been devoted to representing veterans and their families for over 20 years) to make sure our clients know of any risks to their current or future VA disability benefits that could occur.

#### Q: Can I file a VA claim and a (CLJA) tort case?

A: Yes. Bergmann & Moore encourages veterans to file both. To file a VA claim, please reach out to your Vietnam Veterans of America representative.

#### Q: I have a family member who died at CL. Can I file on their behalf?

A: Yes, survivors and loved ones may also bring suit.

#### Q: What are attorney fees and costs related to a CLJA claim?

A: We are in support of action by Congress or the Court to reduce the rate that can be charged by any firm. We believe veterans shouldn't be charged unreasonable legal fees – especially ones with added "costs" that can easily amount to over 50 percent of a veteran's award. Our legal fee is, therefore, 33½ percent. Not only is this fee well below the going rate, but we will charge no costs on top of that fee.

The symbolism of the Vietnam Veterans of America flag is explained below:

The background color is golden yellow, the primary color of the Vietnam Service Ribbon.

In the "hoist" of the flag, the seventeen brown stars, arranged in three vertical rows, represent the seventeen official campaigns of the Vietnam war.

The insignia of VVA, including the identification inscription Vietnam Veterans of America is centered between the campaign stars and the "fly" of the flag.

The VVA insignia incorporates the colors and stripes of the Vietnam Service Ribbon, which was awarded to all the men and women who served in Southeast Asia and the contiguous waters or air space from July 4, 1965, through March 28, 1973.

Surrounding the insignia, in natural colors, is a wreath containing a laurel branch and a sheaf of rice stalks. The two are tied together at the base with a strand of black barbed wire. The rice represents Southeast Asia, and the laurel signifies honor to all who served there.

The black barbed wire serves as a reminder of the POWs and MIAs who are still unaccounted for.
